- Michelle Gehring (Director of Instruction & Learning Support Services gave an overview of School-based learning support services (LSS), including learning support teachers, Youth Care Workers, educational assistants, counselors and district resource room programs. She explained the two branches of the DLSS: Inclusive Education and Safe Schools. She also explained Tiers 1, 2, 3 in Accessing Learning Supports, Tier 3 being the most intensive. She also addressed the 5 common myths related to Special Education and Learning Support. #1- Children need a designation to receive an EA, #2-Schools get funding for a child with Special Needs, so they should have an EA, #3- Pull out groups are the best way to support my child's learning, #4-There are no consequences for students with behaviour problems & #5- My child needs a designation to get help. *Talk to your child's teacher, the case manager (if you have one), the Principal or the LSS department via email at LSS.Department@abbyschools.ca to address any questions or concerns.
