6. DPAC Update

- *Special Guests-Assistant Superintendent Bruce Cunnings & Trustee Jared White
 - -SI Bruce Cunnings presented on student success in literacy and numeracy. Grade 4 results show numeracy trending at or above the provincial average, while literacy shows an overall improvement but a decline amongst Indigenous students.
 - -Early Development Instrument shows 40% of Kindergarten students are vulnerable in one or more of the five areas of physical health, social competence, emotional maturity language, language and cognitive development and communication skills. This is showing growing complexity in schools.
 - -Key initiatives include a literacy framework and administrator training (UFLI) promoting creativity, comprehension, and communication. The Indigenous Working Group prioritizes cultural identity, equity and advocacy to support student success.
